The national system to study the surgical management of a range of neonatal conditions – enabling national audit in neonatal surgery

NETS2HD study:

Thank you to everyone who is helping with the NETS^{2HD} study. The study is now running in 20 of the 28 paediatric surgical centres in the UK and Ireland, and clinical data has been returned for 199 children (79%). Information has also been returned from parents of 83 children, over 80% of those who have been successfully contacted and consented to take part. Data collection will continue until the end of December. Using existing data:

The BAPS-CASS Steering Committee are keen to encourage secondary use of any BAPS-CASS datasets to ensure the data are used as widely as possible to further benefit patients. Datasets for the following conditions are available to be used for appropriate secondary analysis; Congenital Diaphragmatic Hernia, Gastroschisis, Oesophageal Atresia, Hirschsprung's Disease, Posterior Urethral Valves, Anorectal Malformation and Necrotising Enterocolitis. A secondary analysis project has recently been approved using the NEC dataset. Data sharing is undertaken according to the NPEU data sharing policy; please note no personally identifiable data will be shared and this includes hospital and reporter details. If you would like to use any of these datasets to answer a specific research question, please send a brief proposal to *baps-cass@npeu.ox.ac.uk*. Please make sure you include details of the specific question




