

Gastroschisis data collection update


Thank you to all of you who have contributed data to the gastroschisis study. As of 1st July, we have received back 93% of cards and 88% of data collection forms. Sixteen of the 28 units in the UK and Ireland (57%) have returned all their initial report forms for the entire study. Only five units have returned less than 80% of their forms, and only four have returned less than 80% of cards (see figures). We have, to date, data on 361 infants with gastroschisis, analysis of which will provide extremely useful information to inform parent counselling and future management. We want to analyse and feedback the final results as soon as possible and will therefore be closing the dataset at the end of August. Any data not with us by this date cannot be included. We will have written to those of you with outstanding forms; please send your data back urgently to make this a truly representative national study.

Percentage of forms returned


