Hirschsprung's Disease study data collection update

Many thanks to all of you who have contributed data to the Hirschsprung's Disease (HD) study. We have received fewer cards than usual since the commencement of the study in October 2010; as of beginning of March 2011 we have received 78% of cards and 58% of data collection forms.


18 of the 27 hospitals in the UK and Ireland have returned all cards (100%) but only 10 hospitals have returned all data (cards or cards AND forms) to us. 5 hospitals have not returned any cards or forms to us since the study started. We will have written to those of you with outstanding data. Therefore, if you have not already done so please return your cards and forms urgently to make this a truly representative national study.

You can also notify any outstanding or current nil returns or cases by e-mailing baps-cass@npeu.ox.ac.uk, we will post the relevant data collection forms to you.




Also, please let us know if you are not receiving any cards from us, or if your contact details have changed so we can follow up immediately.
