Heart failure in pregnant women


Since February 2019, 133 cases and 266 controls have been recruited.


Safety of induction and augmentation of labour in pregnant women with anaemia + nested coagulation study

- The nested coagulation study is complete.
- All participating hospitals are continuing the induction and augmentation study, but the recruitment rate needs to improve.

The protests in Assam and other states of India since 10th December 2019 has slowed the recruitment process.

- Aim of the event was to disseminate knowledge and information about the opportunities for national and international collaborative research, and generate a list of priority research topics and training needs for the state of Assam.

MaatHRI outputs 2019

- 1. MaatHRI has been established as a standardised research platform built on equitable partnerships.
- 2. The platform expanded and contracted in terms of the number of collaborating hospitals, which makes it dynamic and gives freedom to the hospitals.
- 3. Three training and capacity building workshops were conducted to improve clinical and research skills in the collaborating hospitals, and more than 110 clinicians have been trained.
- 4. We submitted one paper 'Establishing the MaatHRI platform' and another one is currently being drafted 'Coagulation parameters in pregnant women with and without anaemia'
- 5. We submitted three funding applications and although they were not successful, it strengthened the process of co-creation of knowledge.
